#### **BACKGROUND**

#### Our aim:

- To start the formal planning process before the end of the year.
- The new options will explore opportunities and will be informed by local demand and aspirations to help guide this
  approach.
- Overall use of the building can be flexible and provide services that meet the needs of local residents.

#### **Our priorities:**

- Appoint a full professional team that can create an innovative and inspirational design for a newly refurbished and multi-service leisure centre.
- Establish a new, permanent home for Marylebone Library, with multifunctional spaces.
- Re-provide facilities, including large swimming pool with an area set aside for teaching, sports hall, fitness suite (gym)
  and studios.
- Include our cleaner and greener aspirations of becoming a net zero carbon organisation, in line with our City for All strategy.
- Capture improvements that can be made to the surrounding space around the building as well as investment in the building.
- Ensure the building is fully accessible

- Retain and enhance the most significant heritage features such as the inherent art deco design whilst bringing it forward into the 21st century.



- Aligning with the Council's commitment to be zero carbon by 2030








### **EARLY IDEAS: SWIMMING POOL AND SPORTS HALL**

2 x badminton court sports hall + 12x25m pool + learner pool



On 16 March 2021, the council held an update meeting where it was confirmed that the £25 million Capital Budget for this project remains unchanged and is secured for the refurbishment of Seymour Leisure Centre.
